Secretary Report -

I became secretary of the BHRC in 2010 and as I was keen and eager back then, I asked members what they wanted from the club. The overwhelming answer was a Summer Camp! The club had previously run camps at local XC venues, but these had become so popular, the owners of said venues kept the best dates for themselves and charged accordingly. The onus was also on cross country riding, great, unless you are a wimp like me and don't want to jump, just hack, do a bit of schooling and socialise. I put the idea on the back burner.

In 2012, I moved Gem to Paddocks; I noticed that during the summer, a lot of the boxes were unoccupied. I watched Karen Court teaching; I was hugely impressed how she taught, not only established 'good' riders, but nervous beginners and children. A plan began to form. I took the idea I had had 2 years previously off the back burner, talked to Katie Baker and Karen and put my ideas before the committee.

I had been to many Pony Club camps in my childhood and so I decided to adopt a more 'rural' approach. The horses would have stables for the Saturday night, members could sleep in tents or their horsebox, (I was going home to my nice warm bed) Karen could teach everyone and then we could end with a dressage competition. I picked a price - £100 and we decided on a maximum of 12 members.

I put it in the March 2013 newsletter and waited to see what happened. Within a

couple of weeks, camp was full! Set for the beginning of August, I made copious lists; absolutely nothing was left to chance. Paddocks gleamed; the kitchen and toilet were



sparkling, the stables were pristine. Saturday morning was heralded buy thunder and lightning, and so it continued all week-end. We got soaked and muddy but everyone had such a good time that Paddocks and Karen were booked for the following year.

As the beginning of August 2013 had been so dire, I switched tactics and the 2014 camp was at the end of July. I made copious lists; absolutely nothing was left to



chance. Paddocks gleamed; the kitchen and toilet were sparkling, the stables were pristine. Saturday morning was heralded buy the most beautiful sunshine. I had lunch, sat down with a cup of tea and in the distance, I heard the first rumble of thunder and so it continued all week-end. We got soaked and muddy but everyone had such a good time that Paddocks and Karen were booked for the following year.

By 2015 I was a twitching, nervous wreck! I had decided that if this year was as dire as the previous two, I was abandoning the idea of a 'summer' camp altogether. I made copious lists; absolutely nothing was left to chance. Paddocks gleamed; the kitchen and toilet were sparkling, the stables were pristine. Saturday morning was heralded buy the most beautiful sunshine and so it continued for the entire week-end!

I have so many happy memories of the last 10 years of camp; Karen and Darth doing the most amazing dressage demonstration. Kate and Sauber showing us how D2M

should be done for maximum effect, Gem in the marquee eating apples, Dezi doing the whole week-end side saddle, watching members do their first ever dressage test, and/or their first course of show jumps, deciding the colour scheme for the T-shirts, watching Deana and Murphy sailing over the show jumps......the list goes on and I am sure many of you have your own special memories.



And so we got to 2023, our 10th anniversary. Things have been tweaked over the years; we did have 16 members for a couple of years but decided 12 worked best. We did offer clear round jumping and use of the XC fences, but that wasn't particularly popular. The 2020 camp was 3 separate one day camps, with no camping, but Covid didn't stop us.

The cost is still £100, mainly because Paddocks and Karen have been so accommodating and generous.

So we met up for tea on Friday 28th July, ready to start the fun all over again. Mia had the stables organised, bedded down and a 'stable plan' prepared for both campers and liveries. Whilst we were discussing the week-end weather, sat in beautiful evening sunshine, the 'Michael Fish' of the Blackdown Hills (Kate Hopper) sent a text to say we were due rain the following morning at 9.00 am. Ha! Did she ever get that wrong, it started to rain at 9.05 am! It rained long enough for the riders to get wet and Karen to get her Equidry coat on, then the sun came out and although we had a little drizzle Sunday lunchtime, we all managed to stay remarkably dry.

Topaz made a guest appearance on the Saturday afternoon as he was the unmounted demonstration. He thoroughly enjoyed meeting his adoring fans and Kate, Freddie (his breeder) and I explained a little about how he came to be, and how he came to belong to me. He was a very good boy and he may well make another appearance next year.

Karen's demonstration was 'what are you looking for when you go to buy a new horse?' Karen rode one of the Paddocks liveries horses called Hattie that she had never sat on or seen ridden before. Her owner, Jane, explained a little of Hattie's background and then Karen worked her usual magic and got the mare going beautifully; as only Karen can!

Then the dressage started. New member Laura, had her first experience of dressage writing and was word perfect. Gloria read 11 tests and had a well-deserved cream tea afterwards. Emma took over camera duties and stewarding and 3 lovely days came to an end with the prize giving. Achievement Award - Jill King and Dillys. Progress Award - Amanda Webb and Magic Monkey. Instructors Award - Erin Spurell and Ted . Well Done Award - Debbie Friendlander and Leo.

Karen is booked for Summer Camp 2024 (although she doesn't know it yet) and as long as Paddocks welcomes us back, BHRC look forward to doing it all again next July. Tricia x

Making a BHRC payment -

It would help Deana, our treasurer, enormously if you included the following information on your BACs payments.

- If you are paying for flatwork training try to include 'flat/date (of the event)/surname'
- If you are paying for jumping training it is 'jump/date/surname'
- Lectures are 'lecture/date/surname'
- Rallies 'rally/date (of the event)/surname
- Membership member/surname

Health and Safety -

If you travel alone to events with your horse, we suggest you download something like the form below and put it in a prominent position in your horsebox/car whilst you are riding. Due to data protection laws, committee members cannot readily access your details from the BRC database. We also suggest you consider wearing a medical armband, especially for cross country training.

A rider wearing a ROYAL BLUE arm band is hard of hearing - BRC handbook

RED Red ribbons signify a horse kicks.

GREEN - A green ribbon means that the horse is inexperienced.

It is helpful for stallion handlers to put this colour ribbon in their horses' tail, especially if you have a mare as it warns you to stay away.

WHITE: White ribbons are helpful for letting others know that this horse is for sale.

*There will be 9 jumps in the arena. 3 x 40 cm, 2 x 50 cm, 2 x 60 cm and 2 x 70 cm; all will be jumpable both ways. To get a clear round, you need to jump a minimum of 5 fences (this can be the same fence 5 times) and a maximum of 8 fences, a bell will indicate when your round is finished. Riders may be assisted/led. £3 per round; payable on the day. Rosette to all clear rounds.

Class 1 will start at 2.30 pm prompt.

- Class 1 4ocm (no fillers) riders may be assisted but not led
- Class 2 50 cm (no fillers)
- Class 3 60 cm
- Class 4 70 cm

Entry Fees: £10 - BHRC members £12 non - members

Entries close at 8.00 pm on the Wednesday before the event. Entries may be accepted on the day (space permitting) with a £2 surcharge.

<u>The competition</u> will consist of jumping a course of 6 fences (not timed) IMMEDIATELY followed by a further 5 additional fences which <u>will</u> be timed (jump off) and the winner will be the pony/horse and rider combination with the lowest number of faults over the two rounds. In the event of a tie, jump- off times will be used to decide the results.

RULES - Please read to avoid confusion!

- No horse/pony may jump in more than three classes (excluding the clear round jumping)
- If you are attending the event alone, please clearly display EMERGENCY CONTACT details in the front of your vehicle.
- Entries will be limited in each class.
- All horses/ponies must be 4 years old or over.
- This competition will be run under British Riding Club SJ Rules 2023.

1. Riding is a risk sport — ALL COMPETITORS TAKE PART AT THEIR OWN RISK and are expected to exercise due care at all times and to obey all notices placed for their control. The Organisers and Owners of the Venue shall not be responsible or accountable in any way whatsoever for any loss, injury or damage that may happen from any cause or circumstances whatsoever, to competitors, their servants, agents, other members of the public, any animals, property or vehicles bought into the Venue or whilst entering or leaving the same, or for anything else in conjunction with or arising from, or attributable to the Competition. It shall be a condition of entry that each Competitor shall hold the Organisers blameless, and indemnify them against any loss, damage or legal proceedings. **SPECTATORS**, whether or not connected with competitors are also required to comply with the above conditions for their own safety.

COMPETITORS WILL BE EXPECTED TO ABIDE BY HEALTH AND SAFETY RULES WHICH WILL BE POSTED ON THE DAY.

2. THE JUDGE'S DECISION IS FINAL.

3. All accidents/incidents/falls shall be reported to the secretary (whether or not First Aid attention was required) and assistance must be given in recording the event in the accident/incident book. The BHRC recommend that all competitors should have adequate personal sports insurance.

- 4. DRESS: It is the responsibility of all competitors to wear a <u>hat complying with current BRC standards</u>. <u>Waistcoats</u> (plain navy or black) are now permitted and in excessively hot weather, competitors may be allowed to ride without jackets at the discretion of the judge. However, if wearing a waistcoat or riding without a jacket a suitable <u>shirt that covers the</u> arms must be worn
- **5.** Please work-in in the designated area.
- **6.** Anyone riding or handling a horse/pony in a manner that is considered by the Organisers to endanger the safety or wellbeing of any horse, pony, rider, spectator or official will be asked to leave the showground
- 7. The horse or pony is only to be ridden on site by the person competing.
- 8. No refund of entry fees will be given after closing date.
- 9. No horse may compete in more than 3 Classes.
- **10.** Any person using physical or verbal abuse against any committee member, judge, steward, official or helper will be asked to leave the showground and banned from entering competitions in the future.
- 11. It is your responsibility to report to the steward on time for your test. No refunds will be given.
- 12. All dogs must be kept on leads.

the same, or for anything else in conjunction with or arising from, or attributable to the Competition. It shall be a condition of entry that each Competitor shall hold the Organisers blameless, and indemnify them against any loss, damage or legal proceedings. SPECTATORS, whether or not connected with competitors are also required to comply with the above conditions for their own safety. COMPETITORS WILL BE EXPECTED TO ABIDE BY HEALTH AND SAFETY RULES WHICH WILL BE POSTED ON THE DAY.

- 4. It is the responsibility of individuals to familiarise themselves with the correct turnout requirements and permitted tack as detailed in BRC Rulebook 2022
- 5. Protective helmets to current safety standards as detailed in British Riding Club Rulebook 2022 must be worn at all times when mounted with chinstrap fastened.
- 6. Only the person competing the horse may ride it on site and in warm up. Only competing equines may attend the event unless it is a non-ridden companion.
- 7. No tack to be used in the warm up which is not allowed in the competition.
- 8. The organisers reserve the right to alter competition at their discretion.

Time allowed 4 - 5 mins

Class 5 - "Have-A-Go" Dressage to Music - walk, trot and canter

<u>Mandatory Moves:</u> Halts at beginning and end of test –walk, trot and canter on both reins, to include circles and/or a serpentine - free walk on a long rein - any additional moves may be performed

DRESSAGE TO MUSIC RULES and CONDITIONS

#Horses/ponies can enter the same D2M class as an individual as well as part of a pair as long as their music is different.

All DTM test are timed from the first halt to the final halt which has to be on the A-C centre line, but not necessarily at D, X or G.

No more than 20 seconds of introductory music may be played before the entry at A.

A definite signal to start i.e. a big wave, must be given

All BHRC DTM Test will take place in a 20m x 40m Arena.

In the event of a tie, the competitor or pair with the highest mark for Artistic Presentation will be placed highest,

Music must be recorded on a standard CD and it is recommended that each rider has at least one spare copy to hand. CD's must be handed to the secretary at least 30 minutes before the scheduled time of their test. The CD and the case must be marked with the competitors name and which class they have entered. Competitors may provide their own technical adviser to be present to supervise the playing of the CD

#The judges are looking for music that suits the horse, a test that covers the entire arena and looks neat, with a happy horse and rider. A well-executed, simple test that is a joy to watch, will beat an over ambitious test.
