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Secretary Report -

I have just had a fascinating meeting with a lady called Pat who was great friends with the BHRC Chief instructor in the 1980's; her name was Ann Ewing.

The Blackdown Hills Riding Club was formed in 1972 and was huge! 150 members and almost half of those were children, starting from 4 years old. By 1993, however, the club had just 6 members and the Area Rep called an Extraordinary General Meeting to see if there was any interest in the club continuing! Luckily for all of us, there was. And the rest, as they say, is history.

Pat contacted me because Ann had died and left a bequest; she has stated the following - "Award to be called 'The Crinkle Burr Trophy.' To be awarded annually for the <u>BEST</u> horse care and turn-out. If there is nobody up to standard - <u>then this trophy is not to be awarded as second best won't do.</u> This trophy to be awarded annually and held for one year only."

Pat has found a brass horse that we are going to attach to a plinth and get engraved. It will be presented at the AGM, but Pat is concerned it may not get returned each year, so although it will be awarded, it will be kept with me and the incredibly deserving recipient will have a rosette and a photograph with the trophy to keep.

Life for Monte has to be filled with things he is familiar with. We have a couple of nice little hacks we can manage on our own, we go over to the Paddocks once or twice a week to school and he knows and loves his routine.

We join in with the training whenever and wherever there is any and he likes to have company as a rule but if you take his little brother Sauber to the training session then he is not a happy boy! He does not like to have any other horse anywhere near Sauber and he certainly can't concentrate whilst Sauber is in the school with him!

A couple of weeks ago we entered the first leg of the dressage league at the Paddocks. Monte spotted Thomas as soon as we arrived - his best friend from The Stud - who was now going to be his best friend for the day he had decided. Warm up

was a little distracted as he wanted to be with Thomas, however I was just pleased that he was not doing 'airs above the ground'.

Then came our moment in the arena. Those that witnessed that day would not have

believed he had ever been in that arena before, but the problem for Monte was it doesn't normally have dressage boards and a car parked in it and the dressage markers were all in the wrong place! You see he just doesn't like change and a 'major disobedience' and a score of 2 soon followed!

However, we got through two tests - I'm not sure there was much dressage involved but plenty of perseverance and some very positive comments from a very patient



judge. So for those of you out there that don't think you can do it, think again - you won't see much worse than Monte and I, and we will back again for the next leg.

Making a BHRC payment -

It would help Deana, our treasurer, enormously if you included the following information on your BACs payments.

- If you are paying for flatwork training try to include 'flat/date (of the event)/surname'
- If you are paying for jumping training it is 'jump/date/surname'
- Lectures are 'lecture/date/surname'
- Rallies 'rally/date (of the event)/surname
- Membership member/surname

Health and Safety -

If you travel alone to events with your horse, we suggest you download something like the form below and put it in a prominent position in your horsebox/car whilst you are riding. Due to data protection laws, committee members cannot readily access your details from the BRC database. We also suggest you consider wearing a medical armband, especially for cross country training.

A rider wearing a ROYAL BLUE arm band is hard of hearing - BRC handbook

RED Red ribbons signify a horse kicks.

GREEN - A green ribbon means that the horse is inexperienced.

It is helpful for stallion handlers to put this colour ribbon in their horses' tail, especially if you have a mare as it warns you to stay away.

WHITE: White ribbons are helpful for letting others know that this horse is for sale.

GENERAL RULES and CONDITIONS THE COMPETITION WILL BE RUN UNDER BRC RULES FOR DRESSAGE

1. Riding is a risk sport – ALL COMPETITORS TAKE PART AT THEIR OWN RISK and are expected to exercise due care at all times and to obey all notices placed for their control. The Organisers and Owners of the Venue shall not be responsible or accountable in any way whatsoever for any loss, injury or damage that may happen from any cause or circumstances whatsoever, to competitors, their servants, agents, other members of the public, any animals, property or vehicles bought into the Venue or whilst entering or leaving the same, or for anything

else in conjunction with or arising from, or attributable to the Competition. It shall be a condition of entry that each Competitor shall hold the Organisers blameless, and indemnify them against any loss, damage or legal proceedings. **SPECTATORS**, whether or not connected with competitors are also required to comply with the above conditions for their own safety.

COMPETITORS WILL BE EXPECTED TO ABIDE BY HEALTH AND SAFETY RULES WHICH WILL BE POSTED ON THE DAY.

2. THE JUDGE'S DECISION IS FINAL.

- **3.** All accidents/incidents/falls shall be reported to the secretary (whether or not First Aid attention was required) and assistance must be given in recording the event in the accident/incident book. The BHRC recommend that all competitors should have adequate personal sports insurance.
- 4. DRESS: It is the responsibility of all competitors to wear a <u>hat complying with current BRC standards</u>. <u>Waistcoats</u> (plain navy or black) are now permitted and in excessively hot weather, competitors may be allowed to ride without jackets at the discretion of the judge. However, if wearing a waistcoat or riding without a jacket a suitable <u>shirt that covers the arms must be worn</u>
- **5.** Please work-in in the designated area.
- **6.** Anyone riding or handling a horse/pony in a manner that is considered by the Organisers to endanger the safety or wellbeing of any horse, pony, rider, spectator or official will be asked to leave the showground
- **7.** The horse or pony is only to be ridden on site by the person competing.
- 8. No refund of entry fees will be given after closing date.
- 9. No horse may compete in more than 3 Classes.
- **10.** Any person using physical or verbal abuse against any committee member, judge, steward, official or helper will be asked to leave the showground and banned from entering competitions in the future.
- **11.** It is your responsibility to report to the steward on time for your test. No refunds will be given.
- 12. All dogs must be kept on leads.

2. THE JUDGE'S DECISION IS FINAL.

- 3. All accidents/incidents/falls shall be reported to the secretary (whether or not First Aid attention was required) and assistance must be given in recording the event in the accident/incident book. The BHRC recommend that all competitors should have adequate personal sports insurance.
- 4. It is the responsibility of individuals to familiarise themselves with the correct turnout requirements and permitted tack as detailed in BRC Rulebook 2022
- 5. Protective helmets to current safety standards as detailed in British Riding Club Rulebook 2022 must be worn at all times when mounted with chinstrap fastened.
- 6. Only the person competing the horse may ride it on site and in warm up. Only competing equines may attend the event unless it is a non-ridden companion.
- 7. No tack to be used in the warm up which is not allowed in the competition.
- 8. The organisers reserve the right to alter competition at their discretion.
- 9. Please leave the area around your horsebox/trailer/vehicle clean and tidy REMOVE ALL HAY AND DROPPINGS PLEASE BRING own equipment and take hay and droppings home!
- 10. HORSES /PONIES MUST NOT BE TIED TO OUTSIDE OF HORSEBOXES AND LEFT UNATTENDED
- 11. Liability: Neither the landowners, organisers, nor any person acting on their behalf accept any liability for any loss, damage, accident, injury or illness to horses, riders, spectators or any
- 12. BHRC reserves the right to alter the schedule or advertised start time, refuse any entry, amalgamate classes and cancel any class should conditions be or become unsuitable.

- 13. Health and Safety: All who attend the event are responsible for ensuring that they conduct themselves so that they do not put themselves or anyone else at risk. Vehicles must be parked so as not to cause obstruction. Unmounted attendees are requested to keep clear of the warm up area and to avoid behaviour which may alarm horses.
- 14. ANYONE FAILING TO COMPLY WITH THE RULES OR HEALTH AND SAFETY WILL BE ASKED TO WITHDRAW ABUSIVE BEHAVIOUR WILL NOT BE TOLERATED UNDER ANY CIRCUMSTANCES.

DRESSAGE TO MUSIC RULES and CONDITIONS

#Horses/ponies can enter the same D2M class as an individual as well as part of a pair as long as their music is different.

All DTM test are timed from the first halt to the final halt which has to be on the A-C centre line, but not necessarily at D, X or G.

No more than 20 seconds of introductory music may be played before the entry at A.

A definite signal to start i.e. a big wave, must be given

All BHRC DTM Test will take place in a 20m x 40m Arena.

In the event of a tie, the competitor or pair with the highest mark for Artistic Presentation will be placed highest,

Music must be recorded on a standard CD and it is recommended that each rider has at least one spare copy to hand. CD's must be handed to the secretary at least 30 minutes before the scheduled time of their test. The CD and the case must be marked with the competitors name and which class they have entered. Competitors may provide their own technical adviser to be present to supervise the playing of the CD

#The judges are looking for music that suits the horse, a test that covers the entire arena and looks neat, with a happy horse and rider. A well-executed, simple test that is a joy to watch, will beat an over ambitious test.

- Most stables are on shavings
- You need to provide your own hay, please make sure the hay doesn't get mixed in with the bedding.

- All your food is provided (except Saturday lunch) but you may wish to bring a cake or crisps to share

- It is **recommended** that adults wear a body protector for jumping. (This is compulsory for juniors)
